Change Can Be Healthy

New ED and New Programs

Fiscal Year 2019-2020 looked like it would be just another year at SLED. We were growing steadily and the feedback we were getting about the programs we were funding was enthusiastic. We

held a strategic planning session and decided to tweak what we had but we were satisfied to let the momentum carry us forward.

2020, however, was a year of change. At the end of February Morgan Mack-Rose, our Executive Director for over 6 years, told us that she was leaving to be the inaugural Executive Director of the San Leandro Improvement Association. It was a great opportunity for her.

Within two weeks we were under Shelter In Place orders, students were sent home, and the board decided to pause our ED search until the dust had settled a bit. We cancelled our Full Steam Ahead Breakfast. Then we cancelled our Gala.

The type of requests we received for Teacher Mini-Grants changed. The Steam Lab Program Coordinator couldn't be in a lab with students so their jobs shifted to helping with technology and helping students and teachers in any way they could.

And thus ended the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year.

We are now half way into our 2020-2021 Fiscal year and the changes continue. We have a new Executive Director, Terra Cole Brown. We are investing in building out our technology infrastructure and streamlining both fundraising and distribution of money to the school district. There are a lot of changes in what we are funding as a result of changes due to COVID-19, but also as a response to the needs of our growing and changing district.

In conjunction with **Hope Lutheran Church**, we have created a grant fund to provide the **Family & Student Support Services** with a **Wishes & Needs Fund** that would provide fast and flexible funds to support the students most in need beyond what can be achieved using the McKinley-Vento funds.

SLED **Teacher Mini-Grants** provide support for teachers who need supplies and materials for Project Based Learning. This is a much less onerous and less limited way for teachers to obtain supplies than through Donors Choose.

Complementing Project Based Learning are the Career Pathways and Work-Based Learning

initiatives at San Leandro USD's middle and high schools. Both programs expose students to a wide variety of careers and allow them to develop not only hard skills, but the soft skills employers expect.

We have signed MOUs with the Alameda County Office of Education (ACOE) and SLUSD to create joint **Mentorship and Internship Programs**. We will have a pilot program this summer to support student internships as part of the **K12 SWP Farm to Fork Pathway Initiative**.

This will provide stipends to participating students. For some students, the availability of a stipend makes the difference between having to work at a non-skilled, paid summer job, or having a mentor-based, internship experience.

Providing support for an enriched educational experience that helps students to become confident and successful adults has always been at the heart of SLED's mission. We are excited to see our impact grow in partnership with San Leandro's local businesses, San Leandro Unified School District, and Alameda County Office of Education. This pilot program is just the beginning. We have so much more planned.

Our breakfast fundraiser, historically held in April, will obviously be cancelled again for 2021. We look forward to seeing you all in person again and celebrating our work together!

SLED INVESTS \$100,000 IN STEAM LABS


SLED will support the STEAM Labs at Garfield and McKinley Elementary Schools once the district is open for in person elementary education and ready to safely make use of the labs.



Annual Financial Report

Fiscal Year July 1 2019 - June 30, 2020

What a year!

Thanks to the generosity of our ever-growing donor base, and our ability to leverage partnerships with San Leandro Unified School District, the Lampert Byrd Foundation and their Youth Opportunity Scholarships, Ghirardeli, Hope Luthern, and others, we were able to be flexible and respond to all of the changes during our 2019-20 Fiscal Year.

- \$100,000 for STEAM Lab science instruction for 894 elementary students shifted in the spring to the program coordinators helping students with technology and reading support.
- Awarded **Teacher Mini-Grants** totaled nearly \$21,000, including grants for equipment and other things to help with virtual teaching.
- Provided over \$23,000 to allow low-income students to attend Outdoor Education science field trips.
- Leveraged over **\$6,000** in **Youth Opportunity Scholarships** for middle schoolers to explore their interests outside of school.
- Partnered with Hope Lutheran Church to support the Wishes & Needs Fund
- Supported Season of Service-Period of Peace.
- Sent nearly 1,000 students to the San Leandro History Museum.


